Beloved Antiochian Women:

I greet you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as we begin our journey to Pascha. As Christians we are called to dedicate our entire lives to God, however, during this holy season we refocus and intensify our prayer and fasting in order to turn back to God and cleanse ourselves. I pray that every woman, man and child in this archdiocese will come closer to God through repentance and true *metonia* or change during this holy season.

The month of March throughout our archdiocese is known as “Woman’s Month.” Much like what I described above about our need to repent and turn to God throughout the year but have the Great Fast as a time of intensity of our efforts, we honor our Antiochian Women throughout the year, but give special attention to their role in the Church during the month of March.
